Eligible: First year

Presented to the student achieving the highest standing in Printing Processes (GRA 104 and GRA 204) in the first year of the program.

PAC Award of Excellence (\$5000 in total) Donor

Eligible: First year

Eligible: Fourth year

To recognize the leadership achievements of a full-time student enrolled in Graphic Communications Management. To be eligible students must be currently enrolled in the 4th year of the Graphic Communications Management program on a full-time basis, have exemplified student leadership within GCM, through an active leadership role in two or more of the following: GCM Course Union, the GCM Peer Buddy program, an extracurricular team or club, or GCM school council, have completed 3rd year with CGPA of 3.00 or better, and have a clear academic standing.

William Somerville Memorial Scholarship (\$400) Donor

Eligible: Fourth year

To the student who demonstrated excellence in electronic prepress technology (GRA103, GRA203, GRA 323, GRA 423, GRA 533, GRA633) in the first three years of the program.

CUPMAC (College & University Print Management Association of Canada) Award (\$1000)

Donor

Budget form required

Deadline: October 22, 2014 at 12:00 p.m. (noon)

Eligible: Second year

Presented to a student currently in second year who demonstrates overall excellence (CGPA of 3.0 or higher) in their academic work, shows financial need, and excels in the Printing Processes I and Printing Processes II courses from the previous academic year.

R. B. "Tom" Atkins Scholarship (\$250) – Donor

Application required

Deadline: October 22, 2014 at 12:00 p.m. (noon)

Eligible: Second year or higher

Presented to a full-time student currently enrolled in second year or higher in the program, who has a minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average of 3.33 (B+) and has also been actively involved in at least two areas of cultural, athletic, and/or political life at Ryerson. A written statement is required.

Cliff Hawes Memorial Scholarship (\$1000) – Donor

Application required

Deadline: October 22, 2014 at 12:00 p.m. (noon)

Eligible: Current third or fourth year students

To the student best exemplifying Ryerson spirit through scholastic leadership, initiative & deportment while in second year or higher. A written statement is required.

Narinder and Deepa Lal Award (\$7500) – Donor

Budget form required

Deadline: October 22, 2014 at 12:00 p.m. (noon)

Eligible: Second year or higher

To be eligible for this award, students must: have completed first-year in the GCM program and be currently enrolled on a full-time basis; be in good academic standing; have a minimum GPA of 2.67; have demonstrated financial need.

C. J. Graphics Inc. Award (\$1000) – Donor

Application required

Deadline: October 22, 2014 at 12:00 p.m. (noon)

Eligible: Third year

This award is directed towards a group project; open to students who were enrolled in third year in 2013 who have a 3.00 Cumulative GPA or higher. The group project demonstrates benefits of sustainability in the printing industry and must be directly related to eco-sustainability in the graphic communications industry, with a focus on improvements, measurability or cost savings.

Students need to submit their special project report and a rationale outlining why the award should be awarded to them.

Gary Hanna Graphic Communications Award (\$2600) – Donor

Budget form required

Deadline: October 22, 2014 at 12:00 p.m. (noon)

Eligible: Third or fourth year

This award is presented to a student currently enrolled in third or fourth year, with a minimum CGPA of 3.0 or higher & demonstrated financial need.

Best bound book award

Application required

Deadline: October 22, 2014 at 12:00 p.m. (noon)

Eligible: Current third or fourth year students

To recognize the academic achievement in binding by a full-time student enrolled in the School of Graphic Communications Management. The complete application **must include the book, full technical specifications and a well-written 350 to 500 word concise expose**, of how the book was produced, the challenges and the lessons learned.

Xplor Central Chapter Scholarship (\$1000)

Presented to a student who has enrolled in a program of higher education (usually a master's program) following completion of Graphic Communications Management. A written statement is required outlining how the criteria is met.

Canadian Printing Industry Scholarship Trust Fund (\$1250 each, renewable yearly) **Deadline: July 12, 2014, check the website for the actual date**

A \$1250 scholarship awarded to students registering for the full-time Graphic Communications Management program with a minimum average of 80% in 6 OAC's. Students must apply for this scholarship at the time of admission and are subject to an assessment interview. This scholarship is renewable at \$1250 per year throughout the four years of the program, subject to the student maintaining a "B" Cumulative Grade Point Average.

Canadian Printing Industry Scholarship Trust fund **Warren Wilkins Prestige Scholarship (\$5000)**

This award will be given to the incoming student with the highest GPA from High School. The CPISTF board will do the selection. All applications for the CPISTF will be considered for this award.

Baden-Württemberg Scholarship

Deadline: March 31st, 2015

Application required

This scholarship is for students who are going on exchange to the Hochschule der Medien (HdM) in Stuttgart, Germany. Application deadline is the end of March of the year before going on exchange. The next deadline is March 31st, 2015. Xplor Scholarship (\$500 to \$1000)

Deadline: June 30 (Application period: May 1 – June 30)

Who: You must be an active Xplor Member or immediate family of an Xplor member

Scholarship recipients are selected based on their pursuit of a career in the electronic document and communications industry, which includes all phases of document and communication creation and delivery, academic achievement, and participation in school activities and service to the community.

Foundation of Flexographic Technical Association Scholarship (\$3000 each renewable) External

Since 1982, the Foundation of Flexographic Technical Association (FFTA) has been providing financial aid to students who demonstrate an interest in the fields of flexography and/or graphic communications. Recipients are full-time students currently enrolled in a 4-year college or university and majoring in a program with flexography as a course of study, and who have a 3.00 or higher GPA.

Rossini Scholarship

The scholarship criterion remains the same as last year. The scholarship money is \$22,500. A group of up to 4 students can participate on one project. Below is outlined the monetary awards breakdown for both the student/students as well as the educational institution.

First Place: \$13,000

Student award = \$10,000

Institutional award = \$3,000

Second Place: \$9,500

Student award = \$7,500

Institutional award = \$2,000

To be eligible to compete for the FFTA Rossini North America Flexographic Scholarship:

- Applicant must be a full-time student, sophomore or junior, currently enrolled in a 4-year college or university, or a second year student currently enrolled in a 2-year or Technical College going on to a 4-year college or university.

- Project can be submitted by one student or a group of 2-4 students. (If submitted by a group, the group must select a Student Leader.)
- Applicant must be majoring in a program focusing on flexography as a course of study with a 3.0 GPA or better.
- Applicant must produce a flexographic project (due Fall 2014).
- Applicant must complete the application and return by March 15, 2015.

In addition to the monetary award, the student recipient(s) or student group leader recipient will be provided with an all-expense paid trip to the FTA Annual Forum, April 27 – April 30; Baltimore, MD courtesy of Mr. & Mrs. Rossini. The recipients will be announced at the Awards Banquet.
